To begin at the Mouth of Nicholas River, which discharges into Restigonche River on its East Side, about two miles above Jacob Powell's Mill Stream, to extend ten miles up the said Richibucto River measuring along the several courses thereof, and to extend four miles into the Country on each side of the said River, to wit four miles due east and four miles due West from the said place of beginning and from the said extent of ten miles therefrom, containing in the whole fifty one thousand two hundred Acres.
