Whereas it having pleased Government to reserve a certain tract of land on this River for the support of your Petitioners, and as frequent trespasses are committed on said Lands, your Petitioners find it extremely difficult to prevent the same, by not having a sufficient Title or Authority so to do, and as a most humble submit to your Excellency's discretion, praying at the same time that they may be allowed the Privileges of others of this subject's subjects, by granting them the lands so allotted them, or such Proportion thereof, as your Excellency may deem meet, giving to each of them according to the number in Family, commencing at the upper branch of said Reserve on both sides of the same, and extending down the River, as far as such Lots or Lands may extend, running to the rear of said Reserve bounded by the Starved Lake Survey, the same to be granted in one entire Grant. Your Petitioners beg leave further to state that they have sufficient abilities to cultivate the same, and that it is their intention so to do agreeable to the Royal Instructions.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly beg leave to insert the number of Children in their respective Families, and hope your Excellency will be pleased to take their Case into Consideration and grant their request, and as in duty bound will ever pray.

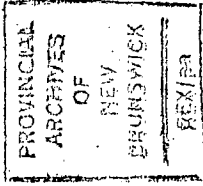
